What a Question!

The question irked Cain. It seemed to unveil his inner feelings—"Where is Abel your brother? Cain's snap answer, "Am I my brother's keeper" (Genesis 4:9)? The asker's (God's) question implied the answer, "Yes!" God's implication for all of us, revealed in His question to Cain, is that how we treat others reflects what's inside, and even one step more, that which reveals our Christian true experience. It is important how we treat others! Now that's scary.

In His six last-day parables found at the end of Matthew 24 and into chapter 25, we find Jesus emphasizing this similar point: How we treat others is part of being ready or preparing for His coming. In the parable of "The Faithful and the Evil Servant" we see Jesus categorizing the servant as evil based on how he treats his fellow servants in everyday life. In the parable of "The Sheep and the Goats" we read this amazing statement from Jesus in Matthew 25:40: " 'Assuredly, I say to you, inasmuch as you did it to one of the least of these My brethren, you did it to Me.' " How we treat others is actually how we would treat Jesus or what we would do to Him!

No wonder Jesus said, "All will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another" (John 13:35).

Optimum Health Seminar

Preventing & Reversing Diabetes

For the past four years our Health Ministries Department, under the leadership of Linda Belz, has sponsored the Optimum Health Seminar—Preventing and Reversing Diabetes in Cumberland County, a program formulated by Steve and Karen Wickham: Grundy Reversing Diabetes Seminars.

With an amazing team of 17, Linda has organized these programs consisting of four doctors plus other medical professionals and generalists, some of whom are outside the Seventh-day Adventist Church. The speakers: Franklin Cobos, M.D., Luisa Manistar, M.D., Michael Olivier, M.D., along with David Manistar, physical therapist, present medical information that most have never heard. Vitals, which are taken at each session by Marilyn Maples and her team, assist the participants in reaching surprising goals in just a few weeks. Pastor David Sitler presents inspirational talks that not only encourage but also add a spiritual component for being healthy. Becky Bennett and her team provide delicious food samples that are served at each meeting to tickle the taste buds. (Eating healthy can be very tasty.)

This year the program host is the Cumberland Medical Center - Diabetes Services, and is held at the medical center. The presentations provide education on the prevention and reversal of Type 2 diabetes by addressing the ways the Standard American Diet (SAD) has worked against us to inflict illness and disease in growing proportions. Learning the effects of sugar, carbohydrates, and fats, as well as the need for responsibility in choosing the proper balance in our diets, are vital factors. The health benefits of a plant-based diet are stressed, along with the need for adding a consistent exercise program.

The participants who attend are eager to learn and are very appreciative of the information that is presented. It has been a wonderful experience, a great place to share God's health message, and in the process to make new friends!
